Privileges of an ISI Fellow

- Has the official title and designation of an ISI fellow at a legally incorporated, non-profit, public benefit organization.
- Has the opportunity to serve as a member of the various organizational arrangements, such as; ISI Standing Committees and Research teams
- Has a standing invitation to all International and regional Conversations of ISI at reduced registration rates.
- Is authorized to organization and be a member of a local/regional chapter
- Has the opportunity to submit papers to the proceedings of ISI Conversations and to the development of knowledge bases.
- Has the opportunity to submit articles or chapters to ISI for publications and external (to ISI) publications (e.g. special issues in journals sources).

Responsibilities of an ISI Fellow

- Is expected to participate (whenever possible) at the International Conversations and at the Annual Meetings of ISI.
- Is expected to serve and make contributions to Standing Committees.
- Is expected to serve on research team(s) in preparation for Conversations.
- Is expected to study systems and design models and methods in projects or programs in his/her “back home” contexts.
- May seek out and nominate Fellows who might make contribution to the program of ISI
- Is requested to make annual contributions to ISI in the amount of \$30.00 (or more if so elected). Contributions are tax deductible.
